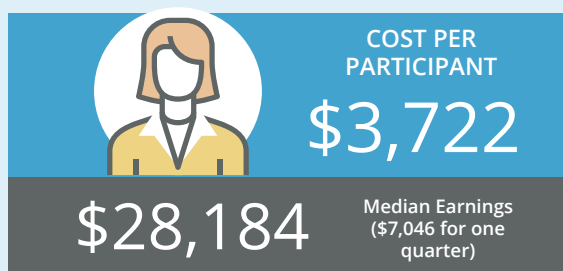

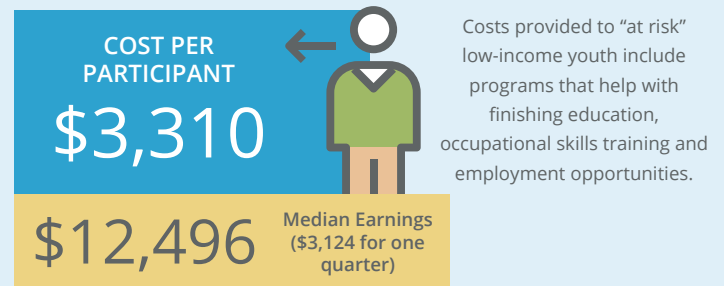
ADULT PERFORMANCE FOR CAREER SERVICES
