Public Comment Concerning the Triangle South Workforce Development Board's Plan of

Service - Program Year 2018

On July 22, 2014, the United States Congress passed the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity

Act (WIOA) [Public Law 113-128] which rescinded the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) of

1998.

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) requires each Workforce Development

Board (WDB) to develop and submit, in partnership with the local chief elected official, a

comprehensive four-year plan to the state. The Triangle South Workforce Development Board's

four-year plan was submitted in May 2016 to the Division of Workforce Solutions, under the

Department of Commerce. Annually, each WDB is required to make yearly updates to the four-

year plan. The WIOA Program Year 2018 Plan provides current information and will be effective

July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019. The Comprehensive Four-Year Plan (Program Year 2016) is

maintained and updated, as appropriate.

In accordance with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, Section 108(d), the workforce

development board shall make copies of the proposed local plan available to the public through

electronic means, such as public hearings, website publication and/or local news media; allow for

public comment no later than the end of the 30-day period beginning on the date the proposed plan

is made available; and, shall include with submission of the local plan any comments that represent

disagreement with the plan.

Therefore, the public is invited to review the current DRAFT of the Triangle South Workforce

Development Board's Plan for <u>Program Year 2018</u>.

Comments must be submitted to the board in writing no later than 4:00 pm on Thursday, May 31st.
